
Day 1 – Monday <u>What to do today</u>

IMPORTANT Parent or Carer – Read this page with your child and check that you are happy with what they have to do and any weblinks or use of internet.

This week your lessons will be based on this comedy video clip so watch it very carefully. You may need to watch it more than once to ensure you catch it all.



1. Watch a video

- Watch <u>Dustin</u> but **stop the video at 0:45**. What have you learnt about Dustin from this first part of the film? What do you think will happen next?
- Stop the film at 0:59 What do you think is in the box?
- Start and stop immediately at 1:00. What do you think Dustin thinks might be in the box?
- Use the Similarities and differences chart (sheet 1) to show the similarities and difference between the two Dustins' (the dog and the cleaner) an example has been completed for you.
- Stop the film at 1:50 (when the cleaning robot sucks up the treat). Make a list of the language you could use to describe how Dustin is feeling.
- Including some of these feelings, write a narration for the section between 3.04 and 3.31 (use sheet 4) Include some of these feelings to write a narration for the section between 3:04 and 3:31.First, have a go at practising using your speech marks using the inverted commas worksheet (sheet 2).
- See sheet 3 for alternative said words resource.
- Sheet 4 narration between the two characters between 3.04 and 3.31.

Day 1 Sheet 2 - Inverted commas

Direct Speech - Speech Marks or inverted commas, show when someone is talking. You will see them written in books as "speech" or 'speech'.

Task One

Going back over task two, how many other words can you think of that you could use instead of the word said. Write down at least eight other words for said. Have a look at the alternative words for said – **sheet 3**


Challenge
