He began to use stencils and by 2000 most of his work was produced by stencilling.

His work often contains a political message (often anti-war or anti-establishment) and he often incorporates images of rats, apes, soldiers, children and policemen.





His work can be found in towns and cities all over the world, from Bristol and London in the UK, to San Francisco, Melbourne, New Orleans and the Israeli West Bank.

A new artwork by Banksy has appeared in a hospital corridor to pay tribute to the nation's hero nurses and doctors. The piece, entitled **Game Changer**, is now on view at Southampton General Hospital.

It shows a boy dressed in dungarees playing with a nurse superhero toy, with figures of Batman and Spiderman in a waste paper basket on the floor.

The nurse, wearing a cape, face mask and a white apron featuring a red cross, has her arm raised as if she is flying. Banksy left a note for hospital workers, saying: 'Thanks for all you're doing. I hope this brightens the place up a bit, even if its only black and white.'
